- Improvement of communications with clubs and members
- Continued development of coaches, officials and mappers

# **Funding**

### 1. Alberta Sport Connection – Provincial Association Development Grant

We signed the annual funding contract with Alberta Sport Connection (ASC) for 2019, and we are thankful for their continued financial support.

The Provincial Budget and our grant stayed almost the same for the current three-year term (2018 - 2020). We continued working with our very supportive ASC sport consultants. ASC's Feb 2018 assessment of AOA outlined some areas in which we need to show improvements in this 3-year cycle (see below:)

- Need to track activities and members in additional Zones.
- Need to improve our programming in additional Zones. (Min 4 Zones)
- Need to improve AOA financial diversity
- Need to improve communications with members
- Need to implement new Sport Policies: Concussion/ Volunteer screening / Safe sport policies

## Recreation and Physical Activity Project - Micro Grant Program 2019/2020

The main goal of this project is to provide affordable, inclusive, developmentally appropriate programming for school aged children that meets a need for alternative, outdoor, multi-sport programming in rural Alberta communities. This addresses our goal of bringing more programming to Zones outside Calgary & Edmonton. This grant enabled AOA to deliver programming to Red Deer and Rocky Mountain House, as well as initial mapping in Grande Prairie for future programing there (in spring 2020).

#### Executive Director Report - 2019 AOA Annual General Meeting



- Spring Skill Development Training camp, May 25-26, 2019: Collaborating with EOOC, AOA organized the Advance Group training in the spring Strathcona Wilderness Center training camp. AOA invited the Danish Junior National Team coaches to help with advanced training and coaches' development. It was a great opportunity to work together with EOOC to serve all members including beginners, kids, families and the advanced group. AOA would like to express a big thank you to the EOOC leaders for offering this opportunity. Special thanks to the Svoboda family for hosting and driving the Danish coaches. We hope to continue with this format and work with both clubs, in alternate years, to deliver similar training events.
- World Orienteering Day (WOD), May 15, 2019: AOA supported a public awareness campaign through social media and ads.
- Alberta Orienteering Championships (AOC) and Camp, June 29-30, 2019: Awards, Prize Draw, and
  refreshments and BBQ for the 2019 AOC. AOA provided medals, organized the prize raffle, and
  delivered a free BBQ to participants and volunteers. The AOC Camp provided free camping
  accommodation for 25 participants. Thank you to FWOC leaders and volunteers for putting so much
  effort into organizing a Middle event, a Relay and a Canada Cup Long event and providing a great
  orienteering experience with excellent courses and welcoming hosting.
- Annual Retreat (Deer Valley Meadows), Nov 2-4, 2018: 36 members attended
- **AOA Grants:** The AOA board reviewed the traditional AOA Grants and adjusted them to better serve the growing number of participants and programs. The Pursuit of Athletic Excellence Grant was discontinued to support different initiatives. The High-Performance Grant will be continued.
- The HPP athletes are supported with the AOA Grant. Congratulation for their inspiring performance at JWOC and WOC. David Svoboda, Michael Svoboda, Emma Sherwood, Michael Kondor, Jan-Erik Naess, Will Critchley, Damian Konotopetz continues with their inspiring enrollment at national and international level of completions.
- The new Leadership Grant will support individuals to further their development as coaches, officials, mappers and club leaders.
- **New club program grants** were introduced in 2019. EOOC and FWOC can apply for Junior Program Development Grant, Underrepresented Group Program Grant and Major Event Hosting Grant.
- Completed and communicated event schedule: AOA has worked with clubs to ensure scheduling of local, provincial, national and international events in Alberta. A new initiative Alberta Compass Series was introduced to encourage participation from across the province at these events.

### Club Services

- Map production of areas outside city limits a new project at Barrier Lake is still ongoing and the Map will be used for 2020 WCOC. Three new maps were created for outreach areas: one each in Red Deer, Grande Prairie and Cochrane
- **Liaison** between clubs and Orienteering Canada: AOA worked with the HPP selection committee to represent AB athletes. Don Riddle and Marion Owen served/assisted on OC Technical and Officials committees. Albertans (key officials & many volunteers) helped organize 2018 COC in Whitehorse, in conjunction with 2018 NAOC there.
- Event promotion for WOD and major Club events: social media promotion and 3 paid advertisements






- Coaching courses: 3 community coaching courses with 40 new participants

# Outreach and collaboration with other organizations

ED has been constantly looking for new opportunities at networking meetings and sport events. Ongoing partnership with Be Fit for Life (BFFL) is going well- 547 participants in 7 communities, and 25 sessions run by BFFL. Calgary Sport Hub partnership was maintained with 800 kids going through an orienteering program in Calgary. RMH Hela Venture Outdoor Education summer camps have implemented orienteering in their program with 125 participants in summer 2019. Red Deer College - Community Try It program had good interest: 30 people attended and established youth program at the fall. Cochrane EB school residency program was a huge success with lots of positive comments. Starting new Cochrane partnership with Notre Dame School using a multi- sport program setting.


